

Wissahickon Transportation Center Project

SEPTA is currently in the design stage of the Wissahickon Transportation Center Project, which will reconfigure and expand the Wissahickon Transportation Center to alleviate congestion and allow pedestrians, bicyclists, and vehicles to more safely navigate the area.

This project will include:

- New boarding areas for buses compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)
- New ADA compliant customer amenities including a bathroom, indoor waiting area, weather protection, and separate boarding and alighting areas for each route
- Other overall safety improvements
- Enhanced connectivity – more and improved route options and service dependability

In preparation for the Wissahickon Transportation Center Project, residents and riders could see demolition of existing structures on the 5000 Ridge Avenue parcel, which includes the former Cadence Cycling and Multisport Center and Restaurant Depot, within the next several weeks. Once started, demolition will take approximately three weeks to complete. SEPTA acquired this parcel in order to expand the existing Wissahickon Transportation Center. Although demolition will begin at 5000 Ridge Avenue, please note that construction for the Wissahickon Transportation Center Project will not begin until the design process has been fully completed. As the design process continues, please note information regarding the design and opportunity for public input will be forthcoming. The design process is approximately 30 percent complete at this time.
